#### WASTEWATER STORAGE POND EXPANSION— CA Correctional Institution, Tehachapi, Kern County, CA

This project was for the construction of a new 41 million gallon wastewater storage pond at the CCI Tehachapi facility.
There were essentially four features of work on this project: 1) SWPPP plan preparation and BMP installation and monitoring; 2)Earthwork to form the basin and sides of the new pond (approximately 16 acres); 3) Underground piping (up to 32 feet deep) to connect the new pond to the existing wastewater system; and 4) Installation of a new HPDE pond liner. SCCI utilized specialty subcontractors for the establishment and implementation of the project's SWPPP program and for the installation of the new HPDE pond liner. All other work was executed using SCCI's skilled in-house crews. At the completion of this project there were no items identified for the punch list.
